Join Spencer Peck, lifelong NJ resident and forty-two year resident of Hunterdon County, on March 21st at the First Presbyterian Church of Titusville. Spencer earned his Bachelor's, Master's and Doctoral degrees in management from Rutgers University. He has been a coin collector and amateur historian since the age of 10. He is a big fan of George Washington and the founding fathers. He is a life member of numerous numismatic associations. Spencer is a retired teacher, Associate Director of Admissions & Financial Aid at Rutgers, and a former Project Manager at Bell Laboratories.

Spencer was the Hunterdon County representative of the 1999 New Jersey Commemorative Quarter Commission. The commission was responsible for proposing the design which was unanimously selected for the state quarter series. The quarter features Washington crossing the Delaware before the Battle of Trenton in 1776. Spencer will discuss his experience serving on the committee.
