Scope and Content

The Thomsen family moved to Pennington, NJ in 1946, when MIchael was 4. His father worked at RCA Laboratories in Princeton. He lived in Pennington and attended local schools until he graduated from high school in 1959. In 2017, while living in Mesa, Arizona, Thomsen wrote a childhood memoir titled "'Pop,' Sam and the Chief: Memories of Pennington, N.J. At Mid-Twentieth Century." It details his memories of growing up, with a focus on the town of Pennington and its residents. The collection includes

photographs of Pennington street scenes and buildings taken by Thomsen and his family members that Thomsen then used in his memoir. Subjects include street views, school teams and trips, parades, teachers and classmates, and Pennington Grammar School. Photographs 41 through 45 are not used in the book. The prints were made by Thomsen from his originals and donated to Hopewell Valley Historical Society.
